As a result, an obsessive-compulsive and related disorder due to another medical condition diagnosis requires that a medical diagnosis be present (APA) The inclusion of this disorder acknowledges that symptoms similar to primary obsessive-compulsive and related disorders can arise as a result of other medical conditions
